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1. ORGANISATION PROFILE

Humanitas Deventer is founded in 1965 and is a residential home for elderly in need of somatic and demential nursing home care. We provide 10 hotelrooms for short stay and we provide homecare in the surrounding area, and a 150 residents live permanently in Humanitas. Annual turnover rate for Humanitas Deventer is 10 million euro. Humanitas has a consistent net profit margin of at least 5% a year. We employ 140 workers in full time employment and 200 volunteers.

Humanitas Deventer transformed from a traditional nursing home into an open community for many people.

2. INNOVATION

Humanitas Deventer is outstanding in three important and innovative ways:

1. Intergenerational Living: meaning mixing elderly with students (since 2012). Young people developing excellent social skills. Elderly revive by the company of youth in the house, both adding value to each other's lives. This ground-breaking intergenerational concept cracked the boundaries and it also delivered foundational insights about how we might create an inclusive society;

2. Building an inclusive community: Humanitas Deventer has created a new social structure, using the power of an elderly community, namely the slowing down of life, making our environment very suitable for many groups with distance to the regular and complex society. Humanitas provides an environment in which people are engaged and empowered, both young and old, people with special needs, teenage mums, refugees, people who are lonely and people in debt relief;

3. Humanitas Deventer is the social backbone for the neighbourhood: everybody can join and contribute to the social environment. We have an art and culture programme for residents and neighbours. People are coming in for free coffee and a chat, children have a safe place for doing their homework after school, men play the billiard competition in Humanitas. In every activity we look for the added value for our residents, to contribute to the rich environment, combined with adding value to society as a whole. Reciprocity is our main principle.



Ageing & Engaging


The Dutch transition from the elderly care towards an integrated part of society 'ageing and engaging' expresses the crux of the matter.



3. QUALITIES

We built our own <u>quality model</u>: Qmanitas, as a compass for integral Quality development, not based on minimalizing risk, neither on safety first. But it is focusing on adding value to the quality of life for our elderly from different perspectives:



Humanitas Deventer is a <u>financial healthy</u> organization. Our management style is pound wisepenny foolish. Meaning, the establishment plan is strict, staffing is efficient, however all small things that contribute to quality of life, are plenty and for free. For example a wine-tasting, concerts and social events, this is how we emphasize life, and how we provide a steady positive financial result. Thus making our model sustainable.
